
Preface

First and Second year students of B.Sc. Genetics along with Dr. Manjula.K R visited the School. The program started with a global warming awareness talk by Dr. Manjula, and followed by a song on global warming by our students. Students were enlightened about the theme through the skit performed by students. Competitions were held for High school children to assess their knowledge about the theme and to check the interest of these young minds in participating for uch socially responsible programs. Program was concluded on an ecofriendly note with distribution of plant saplings.

Go Green Initiative at Nandi Hills

The School of Applied Sciences organized an "Awareness campaign and Cleanliness Drive of Non-biodegradable wastes" as a part of Jagruti Towards Global warming. The first session of this drive was cleaning up of Non-Biodegradable wastes at Nandi Hills, Bengaluru. It was conducted on September 14th, 2019. 200 students from various departments of the School were a part of this campaign along with 20 faculty

members. Dressed in green attire, students dispersed to different areas at Nandi Hills and picked up nonbiodegradable wastes including glass bottles, wrappers, plastic bottles, plastic covers etc. At the end of the day, students were able to collect around 25 gunny bags of waste which was handed over to the authorities for proper disposal. **REVA University is** extremely thankful to Mr Ramesh, Deputy

Step towards a Clean Bengaluru

On the occasion of Gandhi Jayanthi, the School of Applied Sciences organized an Awareness Campaign and Cleanliness drive of Non-Biodegradable wastes at Lalbagh Botanical garden. The drive was flagged off by Dr. P. Shyama Raju and Mr. Chandrashekar, Deputy Director of Horticulture, Bengaluru. Around 600 volunteers comprising students and staff of the University took part actively in the collection and disposal of Non-Biodegradable wastes within Lalbagh premises. As a part of the campaign, a survey on CO2 levels in and around Lalbagh was carried out by the students and faculty of Biochemistry dept. Biochemical analysis was also performed by collecting blood samples of people who worked there and those who come for walking regularly. The causes and prevention of Global warming were depicted through a flash mob by the students near the main gate. As a part of the campaign, the experts from the Wildlife Conservation Society enacted a street play on "Snake Bite: Survival Guide". This drive was a stepping stone to many forthcoming events planned by the University.







Collaborating with the social groups for a Better Cause

The Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike-Lakes Division and the Jala Poshan Association hosted the Jakkur Kere Utsav from 9th November to 8th December, 2019, which was a step towards celebrating our natural heritage and reviving the lakes in Bengaluru. Shri Krishna Byregowda, the Ex-Minister addressed the

gathering on the occasion and gave an insight on importance of water and rehabilitation of lakes in Bengaluru. The programme also included felicitation to people working in the development of Jakkur lake, the launch of magazine Jalashodana and initiation of the Nature's Gurukul programme.

Plantation drive: "Small Sapling, Happy living"

Team Jagruti from the School of Applied Sciences was a part of the Plantation drive held at Jakkur lake on 24-11-2019. A team of 6 members actively took part and planted 70 saplings provided by the L T limited. The volunteers also attended a talk on ground water recharge and its importance in the current scenario. The volunteers were also a part of the demonstration on rain recording and water quality testing.

Orientation and Awareness campaign on Waste Segregation Phase I and II

The School of Applied Sciences in connection with Jagruti towards Global Warming organised an orientation on Waste Segregation on 24-12-19. The Resource persons were Mrs Latha Krishnan, Architect and Mr Vinayak Iyengar. A live demonstration on composting was demonstrated to the audiences, which made the people aware of the types of waste being generated in the society and being responsible towards how we can segregate waste and simultaneously utilize the large proportion of that waste, through converting it into compost. This message was futher taken to society in terms of awareness program regarding waste segregation and "SAY NO TO PLASTICS" which was conducted in two phases I and II.

Phase I campaign was conducted on 27-12-2019 in the villages of Chikkaballapur, Devanahalli, Haliyooru and Yeliyooru. Jagruti volunteers visited around 2000 houses and conveyed to people about the importance of waste segregation and the consequences of using plastics. The sessions were concluded by a Panel Discussion on "Lead Awareness and Global Warming". In a nutshell, all the lectures poured out an immense knowledge on how Lead is affecting at various levels.
